Rich in Rembrandt

Southern California is home of the third-largest assemblage of paintings by Rembrandt van Rijn in the U.S., and the Norton Simon Museum in Pasadena and the Getty Center in Brentwood present concurrent exhibitions on the 17th-century Dutch artist's printmaking. The Getty's **Drawings by Rembrandt and His Pupils: Telling the Difference**, opening Dec. 8, explores the differences between Rembrandt's drawings and those of more than 14 of his pupils and followers. **The Familiar Face: Portrait Prints by Rembrandt**, opening Dec. 4 at the Norton Simon, offers 15 etchings of personalities who sat for the artist, plus self-portraits. pp. 88, 90
